



Clemson University & Los Angeles Challenge

Over the summer, two of our Los Angeles Challenge Scholars had the opportunity, due to your generosity, to attend Clemson University's Remote STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math) Program for 8–12-year-olds. Each student enrolled in two different one-week classes—engineering and chemistry. One week prior to each class, Clemson sent our students a box of materials needed to carry out the experiments they would perform during class time. Despite having to be ready for online learning at 6:30 in the morning due to the time difference with South Carolina, the experience was a great success as each student learned so much with the hands-on learning as opposed to just watching a lesson via Zoom. Moreover, these classes were most apropos since their schools' labs were closed due to Covid-19.

In the Fall, and again this Spring, Clemson offered our students an opportunity to join their online STEM Club. Each club membership consisted of 6 pre-recorded programs designed to supplement our students' daily "remote" schooling. The students had two weeks to access each program and carry out their individual lab work with Clemson provided supplies. Five students took advantage of this opportunity in the Fall and two in the Spring.

This program was an important enrichment for our students to advance their scientific knowledge during the pandemic when they had no ability to use school science labs or engage in any hands-on learning. We hope to continue our students' interest in STEM fields and encourage them to further participate in online learning opportunities. Our students are hungry for more knowledge and experiences as they prepare for college and beyond; Clemson provided our students with a taste of the kinds of learning many college students receive—and our students are in middle school!

The Board of LAC and our students thank you for giving them the opportunity to expand their knowledge and interest in scientific pursuits.

Indeed, the students in the Los Angeles Challenge have endured an unimaginably difficult year. Despite this, I have witnessed resilience and dedication among our students. They are working hard, learning, and getting great grades. With your support, we have provided technology, tutoring, mentoring, and guidance for our students and their families over the past challenging year. Sadly, the father of one of our 8th grade students passed away suddenly early in 2021. This student's mom told me recently that her daughter's acceptance into a prestigious high school has uplifted both of them and given them hope and inspiration. She said this was only possible because of the scholarship we provided along with the encouragement and help we gave as they went through the rigorous application process. I am proud that our organization does so much more than simply write checks.

On a happier note, a few of our students told me that, despite all of the difficulties created by the pandemic, some good came from it. Some students said their family became closer while spending more time together. One said that "a united family can overcome any obstacle." Other students gained a new appreciation and respect for the elderly who have needed more protection and care. Finally, one student told me P.E. was much easier on Zoom than with the coach.

Thank you for your partnership with us as we work to uplift these students and their families.
